## Homework

- Consists of..
  - Reading for 100 minutes per week
    - ✓ Write down your minutes every week on the Homework Calendar
  - Weekly Spelling Words
    - ✓ Spelling Tests every Friday
  - 3 Activity Choices per week (1 from Writing, 1 from Reading, 1 from Math)
    - ✓ Write down your activity on the Homework Calendar once completed
    - ✓ Use the Homework Journal to share your "Activity" with your teacher
    - ✓ You must have 3 "Activities" every week.
    - ✓ You may choose 3 activities from the monthly "Homework Choices" paper *or come up with your own. (This is where you can challenge your child.)*
    - ✓ Mrs. Bromiley will check off the Homework Calendar & Journal every Friday
    - ✓ There are also Reading, Math, and Writing Toolkits that may be useful.

### EXAMPLE Homework Choices:

## 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade September Homework Choices

Please label and date your homework in your homework journal and bring it on Friday!



### Math

- M.1. Count by 2's, 5's, & 10's to at least 100.
- M.2. Write down 10 numbers in standard form and expanded form.
- M.3. Write 5 odd numbers and 5 even numbers. Write down the rule to know if a number is odd or even.
- M.4. Write all of the numbers you can make using a 3, 8, and a 2.



### Reading

- R.1. Read out loud to someone. Stop and retell the story.
- R.2. Write down the title, author, and list the characters in 3 stories you have read.
- R.3. List the genre elements that make a story a fairy tale.
- R.4. Read a story out loud. Write down the beginning, middle, and end of the story.



### Writing

- W.1. Write about something you did this summer.
- W.2. List 5 nouns, 5 verbs, and 5 adjectives.
- W.3. Practice writing "perfect sentences". Write at least 4.
- W.4. Write down at least 10 "juicy" or interesting words you have noticed while reading.
